Through a combination of national and international events, the Speed Dating mechanism fosters intercultural dialogue, professional mentoring, community engagement, and idea incubation. This guidebook outlines the step-by-step process for planning, facilitating, and participating in these events—empowering organizers and participants alike to make the most of this collaborative opportunity.

Whether you are a youth participant seeking inspiration, a mentor ready to share your expertise, or an event facilitator looking for guidance, this tool is your entry point into a more connected and collaborative youth ecosystem.

> Facilitate structured and meaningful conversations among participants.




















- ➤ Encourage collaboration and idea-sharing through quick, focused interactions.

- > Integrate project incubation, allowing participants to refine and develop their ideas with professional guidance.



















Platform Overview: How It Works

The Youth Match Point platform serves as the digital foundation of the Speed Dating Events, streamlining the process of connecting young people and mentors based on meaningful compatibility. It enables participants to engage in purpose-driven conversations and collaborations through intuitive features and smart matching technology. The system is designed to ensure that every interaction is guided by shared interests, complementary goals, and a desire for mutual learning.

Here's how the platform works:

Profile Completion: Participants fill out their profiles with relevant information such as interests, skills, goals, and engagement preferences. During registration, all users-whether young people or mentors-are required to answer a series of questions based on the thematic areas they are most interested in. These questions differ for each group to reflect their roles, motivations, and expertise.

Matching Algorithm: The platform uses the responses to analyze participant data, identify commonalities, and generate compatibility metrics.

% Match Score: A compatibility percentage is displayed on user profiles, offering a visual cue of shared interests, goals, and thematic alignments. This score is calculated based on users' answers in relation to others—whether mentors or peers.

Friend Request Functionality: Users can search for either mentors or other young people who share common interests. Before accepting a friend request, users can click on "% Calculate Match" to view their compatibility score. This ensures intentional, interest-driven connections that support deeper collaboration and mentoring opportunities.



















Thematic Areas

The Speed Dating Events are organized around six key thematic areas, carefully selected to reflect the pressing needs and interests of young people and youth workers today. These themes help structure the conversations, foster targeted matchmaking, and guide the project incubation process. Each participant will be matched according to their primary area of interest to ensure relevance and depth in every exchange.

> Targeted Skill Development and Mentorship

Focuses on supporting young people in transforming their ideas into action. Discussions may include leadership development, increasing employability, navigating the job market, and gaining practical knowledge through mentorship. Mentors can help youth build confidence, sharpen their skills, and receive personalized feedback on project ideas or career goals.

> Accessible and Flexible Community Engagement

Centers on how young people can actively engage with their communities through volunteering, European Solidarity Corps, and Erasmus+ initiatives. These conversations can highlight experiences in mobility, inclusion strategies, and innovative outreach methods to increase participation in civic life.

> Amplifying Youth Voices and Agency

Emphasizes youth participation in decision-making, organizational roles, and intercultural learning. Young participants can share their experiences in self-managed projects, run youth initiatives, or work with marginalized communities. Mentors may offer insights on advocacy, inclusive leadership, and how to create safe and empowering environments.



















> Leveraging Technology for Engagement and Connection

Explores how digital tools-especially AI-can enhance learning, advocacy, and social inclusion. These discussions can cover practical examples of AI-powered platforms, ethical digital practices, and how technology can bridge gaps in access and participation. Participants may also exchange knowledge about tools for collaboration, digital storytelling, or campaigning.

> Collaboration and Partnerships

Investigates how to form effective collaborations, whether among peers or with institutions. Thematic exchanges can touch on identifying complementary strengths, roles in partnerships, communication strategies, and accessing networks or funding opportunities. Both mentors and youth can share tips on cross-border cooperation and strategic alliances.

National Level Topics

These vary by country and are tailored to address specific regional needs and challenges. Topics may include national youth strategies, policy reforms, local activism, or cultural initiatives. National sessions ensure that local realities and contexts are not overlooked, encouraging grounded and context-specific dialogue. By structuring events around these themes, Youth Match Point ensures meaningful, focused exchanges that help foster real growth, learning, and collaborative action.



















Speed Dating Rounds

Organizing a Speed Dating event requires thoughtful planning and an understanding of the interactive structure that makes it successful. Below are guidelines and recommendations for those facilitating an event:

Format: Events may include:

- ➤ 1-on-1 Sessions (5-7 minutes each): Participants engage in quick individual conversations to share ideas, interests, and goals.
- ➤ Small Group Discussions (10–13 minutes): Participants are divided into themed breakout rooms for structured dialogue around shared interests.

Platform: Zoom will be the primary tool for hosting the events. Organizers should utilize breakout rooms to manage different discussion formats and ensure smooth transitions between rounds.

Matching: Organizers will rely on the % Match Score generated by the platform to group participants based on their thematic interests, skills, or mentoring goals. This fosters targeted and relevant discussions.

Moderator Role: Assign moderators to each group or session to guide conversations, monitor time, and ensure all voices are heard.

Timekeeping: Stick to strict timing for each session to maintain pace and energy throughout the event.



















Flexibility: The duration and specific structure of each event may vary depending on the number of participants and their preferred languages or formats.



















Project Incubation Component

The Project Incubation Program is a dynamic and participatory initiative that helps young people turn creative ideas into actionable projects. With support from a digital platform and expert mentors, the process includes:

Step 1: State Your Project Idea

Participants articulate their ideas clearly, identifying the problem, target audience, goals, and actions. They are encouraged to include visual elements and personal motivation.

Step 2: Validate and Refine Your Idea

Through a guided SWOT analysis, participants explore the strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and threats related to their idea.

Step 3: Business Model Canvas

Participants map their ideas using the Business Model Canvas, thinking through key areas like value proposition, partners, activities, resources, and funding sources.

Step 4: Mentoring Sessions

Mentors provide strategic advice and encouragement to refine the ideas and develop realistic implementation plans.

Step 5: Training on Pitching

Participants learn how to present their ideas effectively through storytelling and structured pitching sessions, including video pitches.

Step 6: Fundraising Plan



















Youth are guided to develop sustainable fundraising strategies. This includes:

- Understanding diversified revenue streams
- > Building long-term donor relationships
- Learning adaptability in funding strategies
- > Exploring digital tools and donor management systems
- ➤ Setting SMART fundraising goals
- Attracting and retaining donors
- ➤ Leveraging partnerships and exploring alternative revenue streams

The Project Incubation Component ensures that promising ideas don't just stay ideas but evolve into sustainable projects capable of creating real-world impact.
